#### Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund (TTPSF)

# Agency

## **Program Description**

The TTPSF emphasizes the development of strategic transportation safety plans using a data-driven process as a means for Tribes to determine how transportation safety needs will be addressed in Tribal communities. Transportation safety plans are a tool used to identify risk factors that lead to serious injury or death and organize various entities to strategically reduce risk. Transportation safety plans are aimed at preventing transportationrelated fatalities and serious injuries in a locality that may include:

- A goal and timeline for eliminating fatalities and serious injuries;
- An analysis of the location, severity, and contributing factors of vehicle-involved crashes in a locality;
- An analysis of community input, gathered through public outreach and education;
- A data-driven approach to identify projects or strategies to prevent fatalities and serious injuries in a locality, such as those involving:
- a. Education and community outreach;
- b. Effective methods to enforce traffic laws and regulations;
- c. New vehicle or other transportation-related technologies;
- d. Roadway planning and design;
- e. Mechanisms for evaluating the outcomes and effectiveness of the transportation safety plan, including the means by which that effectiveness will be reported to residents in a locality.

## Eligible **Applicants**

Federally recognized Indian Tribes listed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (86 FR 18552 or updates). Other entities may partner, but only a Tribe may apply. Each application may include only one project; multiple applications from the same Tribe will be evaluated separately.

### **Eligible** Activities/ **Projects**

Projects must correct/improve hazardous road locations or address highway safety problems. Eligible activities include:

- **Safety Plans** (new up to \$15k; update up to \$10k, if  $\geq$ 3 years old)
- Data assessment, improvement, and analysis activities (e.g., crash data systems, traffic records)
- Systemic roadway departure countermeasures (e.g., curve warning signs, rumble strips, markings, delineators, clear zones)
- Infrastructure improvements & other eligible activities as listed in 23 U.S.C. § 148(a)(4).

#### **Review Criteria**

## **Review Criteria**

Applications are rated **Highly Qualified** / **Qualified** / **Not Qualified** across four categories:

- **Transportation Safety Plans** 
  - Criteria: Requests (up to a maximum of \$15,000) for development of a new transportation safety plan; or requests (up to a maximum of \$10,000) to update an existing transportation safety plan that is at least 3 years old.
- Data Assessment / Improvement / Analysis
  - Criteria: (1) Strategic Safety Planning, (2) Supporting Data, (3) Facility Ownership.
- **Systemic Roadway Departure Countermeasures** 
  - Criteria: (1) Strategic Safety Planning, (2) Supporting Data, (3) Systemic Prioritization, (4) Facility Ownership.
- Infrastructure Improvements & Other Eligible Activities (23 U.S.C. §148(a)(4))
  - Criteria: (1) Strategic Safety Planning, (2) Supporting Data, (3) Expected Crash Reduction, (4) Facility Ownership, (5) Time Since Last Award.
